




Student Commitment & Requirements:

This class is for the serious art student who is willing to work extremely hard. Students need to be committed to the entire portfolio making process, completing all three sections and submitting the portfolio.

It needs to be emphasized that this course is to be an ongoing creative process in which the student uses informed and critical decision making and creating artwork based on a variety of resources, and critical thought. Creativity comes from within, but is driven and fed by hard work and determination. Your commitment to hard work will determine your outcome. Contemporary artist Chuck Close said that he does not get artist block, because when he is working he is critically thinking of different way to complete the work or experiment with the process. Later instead of wondering what to do he experiments with the process and works on the other ways of finishing the work. It is an ongoing process involving critical thought and discussion which produces a truly original piece of art.




COURSE: The class is divided into 3 sections. The student would decide which portfolio section to complete;
