### COURSE DESCRIPTION AND CORE OBJECTIVES:

In this college level course, students will intensively study American government. There will be a focus on the various institutions, groups, beliefs, and ideas that constitute the U.S. political system. This course satisfies the U.S. Government requirement and is designed to prepare students for the AP Exam.

Students will cultivate their reading, listening, evaluating, and analyzing skills in terms of effectively communicating the main themes of American government and politics. Students will also be expected to make broader connections between events in U.S. Government and other world events in preparation for the A.P. Government and Politics Exam. The course will be taught using a thematic approach which will often overlap the 6 different conceptual themes in the course:

- I. Constitutional Underpinnings 10%
- 2. Political Beliefs and Behaviors 15%
- 3. Parties, Interest Groups, Media 15%
- 4. Institutions 40%
- 5. Public Policy 10%
- 6. Civil Rights and Civil Liberties 10%
